SYNOPSIS

Youngho (Shin Seokho) goes to see his father who is tending to a famous patient. He surprises his girlfriend, Juwon (Park Miso), in Berlin where she is studying fashion design. He goes to a seaside hotel to meet his mother and brings his friend Jeongsoo (Ha Seongguk) with him. In each instance, he anticipates an important conversation. But sometimes a shared look, or a shared smoke, can mean as much as anything we could say to those close to us.

For his twenty-fifth feature as director (and his first as cinematographer), Hong Sangsoo offers a simple tale of young people on the edge of adulthood. Through their various encounters—with parents, friends and parents' friends—Youngho and Juwon are left to wonder: "Will we be okay?"

DIRECTOR'S BIO

Hong Sangsoo was born in 1960 in Seoul and studied filmmaking at Chungang University before receiving a BFA from California College of Arts and Crafts and an MFA from the Art Institute of Chicago. In 1996, he made his first feature film *The Day the Pig Fell Into the Well*. Since then, through the 26 films he has written and directed, Hong has enjoyed exploring the complex architecture beneath his characters' seemingly random lives. Renowned for his unique cinematographic language and aesthetic choices, Hong Sangsoo is one of the most established auteurs in contemporary Korean cinema.
